

Questions and Answers for NBCH3090001-R-0006 Amendment 0002

1. Paragraph 1.6 indicates that there will be a Technical Section, per 1.6.2, and a Price Section, per 1.6.3. Under general instructions for proposal submissions (3.1), in particular under the Technical Section (3.1.1.3), the Technical Proposal is limited to 20 pages. However under the Price Section (3.1.1.5) there is no respective mention of a page limit for the Price Proposal. Then under Technical Section of Proposal (3.3), General Instructions (3.3.1) indicates a Part I – Technical, and a Part II – Price.

Q: Is the Price Proposal to be included as part of the Technical Proposal and therefore count as part of the Technical Proposal 20 page limit?

A. No, There is a price proposal and a Technical proposal. They are separate deliverables.

2. At the recent NSAC/NSATC General Meeting it was suggested during the RPP review that the Management Section be treated as a separate volume with its own page limit. Was this suggestion adopted so as a Management Section will stand as a separate volume with its own page limit?
  - A. The management section is separate from the technical section, so the 20 page limit does not apply.
3. In section 3.2.4 it is stated that “each proposal submitted must include, in addition to... a. Executive Summary: 3 pages maximum. B. Teaming: ...” Is there a page limit on the Teaming description, and are the Executive Summary and Teaming description to be treated outside of the 20 page limit of the Technical Proposal?
  - A. There is no page limit on the Teaming section. Teaming and the Summary are outside the scope of the Technical section, thus not limited to the 20 pages for the Technical section.
4. The Proposed SOW (3.1.1.4) is referred to as “This Section...”, as with the “Price Section”, is the Proposed SOW a separate section or volume exclusive of the Technical Proposal and respective 20-page limit or is it to be submitted as an Appendix to the Technical Proposal?
  - A. The SOW is not part of the Technical 20 page limit.
5. Considering the number of sections and/or appendices/attachments and the requirement for submission in Microsoft Office format, are separate Word or Excel files anticipated for each section and/or attachment or are all Word and Excel files to be consolidated?
  - A. Separate or combined files are acceptable.
6. I have a question on RPP para 2.8.10 Final Deliverables. Confirm Final means at the end of the four (4) year project period, not the end of the one (1) year technology demonstration (Phase 1)?
  - A. Correct. Deliverables will be at the conclusion of the program. (4 year period) per para 2.8.10.
